

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Scholarship Value	This scholarship offers a reduction of 15% or 30% of the tuition fee.
Scholarship Duration	For the minimum standard full-time duration of the scholar's chosen undergraduate or postgraduate program as specified on the Offer of Admission as accepted by the student.
Payment details	<p>The scholarship payment will be made in the form of a tuition fee waiver directly into your tuition fee account thereby reducing your tuition fee liability by the scholarship amount for each teaching period during the specified duration of study. Please note that the tuition fee waiver may not be reflected on your tuition fee account until the census date of your intake.</p> <p>The following scholarship terms and conditions are applicable to scholarship recipients who have commenced with The University of Adelaide in 2021, 2022 or 2023.</p>
Scholarship conditions	<p>This scholarship is subject to the following terms and conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This scholarship is based on academic merit. Students with the minimum score will be eligible for the indicated scholarship percentage if the qualification and score are the basis of admission to the respective level program: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) A minimum ATAR of 80 (or equivalent) will be eligible for the 15% scholarship for undergraduate (UG) level program b) A minimum ATAR of 90 (or equivalent) will be eligible for the 30% scholarship for undergraduate (UG) level program c) A minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.0 on a 7.0 scale or equivalent for 15% scholarship for entry to an undergraduate (UG) or postgraduate (PG) level program. d) A minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 6.0 on a 7.0 scale or equivalent for 30% scholarship for entry to an undergraduate (UG) or postgraduate (PG) level program. <p>Students who have completed a qualification equivalent to a vocational program with satisfactory, competent, successful completion or pass grades will be provided a scholarship to a maximum value of 15%.</p> 2. The following students are not eligible to receive this scholarship: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Students who have not received an offer for the scholarship. b) Students who are recipients of a scholarship awarded by a recognised scholarship awarding body such as a government ministry or department should the value of the initial scholarship be greater than 50% of tuition fees. c) Students who are studying Masters by Research or PhD programs. d) Students who have packaged offers of University of Adelaide College or Eynesbury programs (packaged) with a University of Adelaide degree. e) Current University of Adelaide scholarship recipients applying for an internal transfer are not eligible to transfer this scholarship to the next program if deemed eligible for the transfer. The applicant will be considered for the available scholarships at time of application, if eligible. 3. The Global Citizens Scholarship is assessed automatically at the time of application. Applicants will be notified of their eligibility for the scholarship within the Offer of Admission, if deemed eligible. 4. The scholarships provide a tuition fee waiver of the scholarship value for the duration indicated in the Offer of Admission for study at the University of Adelaide. 5. The scholarships do not cover the costs of visas, Overseas Student Health Cover, travel, accommodation, living expenses, books and study materials or any other expenses associated with living in Adelaide or study at the University of Adelaide. 6. The scholarship is not paid for courses/subjects where credit is granted in recognition of prior learning/study. 7. The scholarship is not transferable to a third party or redeemable for cash.

8. If an individual receives more than one Offer of Admission from the University of Adelaide, the latest Offer of Admission supersedes any previous offer issued to the student and the scholarship mentioned within the latest offer (if eligible) will be awarded.
9. Scholarship holders must commence study in the University of Adelaide in the study period for which the scholarship was offered. The scholarship cannot be deferred to a different commencing intake. The student will instead be assessed for the scholarship available at the time of application or consideration of the deferral request.
10. The scholarship holder must be enrolled in the undergraduate or postgraduate coursework program of study for which the scholarship was awarded.
11. Scholarship holders are required to enrol in the University of Adelaide program of study as international students* and must maintain international student* status for the duration of their enrolment in the University. The scholarship will be terminated if a student ceases to be an international student*.
12. Scholarship holders are required to enrol in a **full time study load for each study period of their degree**. The scholarship may be payable for a study period if a student is **approved** by the University to undertake due to compassionate and compelling circumstances to undertake less than a full time study load and the scholarship duration will remain the same length as per the original Offer of Admission.
13. If a scholarship holder enrolls in more than the standard full time unit load required for the year, or in any way accrues additional tuition fee liabilities, the additional tuition fees are not covered by the scholarship.
14. The scholarship holder must pay their tuition fees within the stipulated payment deadlines.
15. If a scholarship holder faces exceptional circumstances requiring him or her to return home during their studies and this occurs after completion of the first study period with approval from the University to take a leave of absence they may be able to apply for a one year deferment of enrolment without loss of scholarship, provided this is approved under the student visa requirements.
16. If a scholarship holder enrolls in courses in another institution, including cross-institutional study, those tuition fees are not covered by the scholarship.
17. If a scholarship holder is required to repeat a course the student is liable to pay for the tuition fees for the repeated course.
18. The University does not represent that this scholarship will be tax free to the recipient. The recipient should seek independent advice on the tax implications of this scholarship.
19. The scholarship holder agrees to notify the university immediately if the scholarship holder intends to:
 - a) Transfer to another program within the University.
 - b) Discontinue full-time study.
 - c) Transfer to another institution.
 - d) Seek a retrospective withdrawal from any courses they have enrolled in.
 - e) Defer their studies and/or apply for Approved Leave.
20. The University reserves the right to vary the awards, withdraw or not to offer scholarships if:
 - a) applicants have not achieved or cease to meet the eligibility requirements of the awards; or
 - b) the scholarship holder has been found to have supplied incorrect or misleading information during the application process; or
 - c) a scholarship holder fails to maintain good academic standing and progress; or
 - d) there is a case of serious misconduct by a scholarship holder; or
 - e) in any other case where the University determines that the scholarship eligibility requirements have not been met.
21. The scholarship holder may be required to participate in a photo shoot and complete a testimonial for the University, which may be published on our website or used for other promotional purposes. The scholarship holder must be willing to be featured in such promotional collateral produced by the University and be involved in promotional activity arranged by the University. Accepting the terms and conditions of this scholarship confirms a scholarship holders consent to be used for promotional purposes.
22. The University is obligated to conduct yearly reviews of each scholarship scheme and reserves the right to make changes without notice. Should this happen, all students who are currently receiving, or have been offered a scholarship, will continue to have the terms of their scholarship honoured.
